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I. Course

Description:

Art 1 is a basic course that provides a foundation for additional art courses that follow. This course is primarily devoted to providing systematic presentation of various art processes, theories, and historical developments. The approach to art experiences during this time is experimental in terms of materials but structured in terms of providing students with a strong foundation in design, drawing, and vocabulary. II. Course

Objectives:

- Introduction to the Visual Elements of Art and the Principles of Design
- Production of projects using the following Visual Elements of Art: Line, shape, form, texture, value, color
- Drawing from Direct Observation: Ex: still lifes, portraits
- Proficiency in basic one point and two point perspective and proportion
- Beginning level ceramics skills including but not limited to carving and pottery making.
- Overview of basic art history
- Introduction to the concepts of analyzing and describing art work using the Visual Elements and Principles of Design

III. Classroom

Expectations/Rules:

Be to class on time and prepared for class. Follow directions. Always give your best effort. Complete assignments on time. Treat others with respect. Use art materials in a safe and responsible manner.

IV. Grading Policy:

Project grades (tests) will account for 70% of the grade, with the remaining 30% being determined by quiz/daily grades. The grading scale is as follows: A (90-100), B (80-89), C (70-79), D (65-69), and F (below 65). Grades will be a reflection of mastery of the standards. Make sure all absences are excused as class work can be made up and graded for excused absences only. The Final Exam counts for 1/5 of final grade.
