



Highlights of Madison City Schools



- ✓ 12th largest school district in the State of Alabama
- ✓ Ranked #1 district in Alabama by NICHE out of 137 Alabama public school systems
- ✓ Earned an A on the Alabama education report card (district & all schools) in the last 3 consecutive years they were issued by the Alabama Department of Education.
- ✓ Nationally recognized Fine Arts program

Students are also served through our Community Based program that utilizes 8 job sites and serves an average of 100 students.

- ✓ Active English Learner student population is 4.91% which matches the state average; 7.06% active and monitored; 10% of our EL student population qualify for Gifted and Talented Services
