Course Syllabus

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

Education and Training is a one-credit course. This course is the prerequisite for all pathways included in the Education and Training cluster. The course is designed for students who are interested in pursuing careers in education. Course content includes the organizational structure of education, careers, the role of the teacher, characteristics of effective teachers, communication skills, the teaching and learning processes, learning styles, research, characteristics of positive classroom environments, human growth and development, curriculum development, student characteristics, teaching techniques, learning activities, educational initiatives, technology, and careers. Observational experiences are a required component of this course. Career and technical student organizations are integral, co curricular components of each career and technical education course. These organizations serve as a means to enhance classroom instruction while helping students develop leadership abilities, expand workplace-readiness skills, and broaden opportunities for personal and professional growth.

COURSE OBJECTIVES:

The program objective is to provide students with the content knowledge and skills necessary to direct, operate, and teach in an early childhood education program.

- 1. Apply math, writing, critical-thinking, and problem solving skills effectively in an educational setting.
- 2. Determine safe, healthy educational settings.
- 3. Practice goal-setting and teamwork in an educational setting.
- 4. Interpret Alabama Quality Teaching Standards and the Alabama Code of Ethics.
- 5. Determine the importance of professional organizations.
- 6. Analyze the organizational structure, funding sources, history, and current issues in U.S. education.
- 7. Evaluate the impact of child development on the teaching and learning processes.
- 8. Critique the roles and effectiveness of faculty and staff in an educational setting.
- 9. Analyze learning and teaching styles and the steps in the learning process.
- 10. Practice effective communication skills.
- 11. Design curricula for student excellence.
- 12. Use technology to manage documents, communication and data.
- 13. Analyze careers options in the field of education.

CLASSROOM EXPECTATIONS

- 1. Good attendance is required for an adequate learning experience.
- 2. Bring all required materials to class each day.
- 3. Show respect to all persons (as well as their property) in class.
- 4. Follow directions the first time they are given.
- 5. Students who are tardy to class will be assigned to detention that must be served after school the following school day.
- 6. Student will have 3 days to bring in an excuse for their absence in order to be allowed to get credit for their make-up work. Zeros will be issued for all missed

work until the excuse has been approved and the make-up work has been completed.
