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Course Description:	Technical Theatre 9 Weeks - DMS 6th, 7th and 8th Grade Students Fee: \$15 Prerequisite: Beginning Theatre In this 9 week course, students will learn how to work backstage for theatrical productions including how to work basic lights and sound, acquiring and making props, set design, set building, costume design, sewing, makeup design and application, and how to work as a set crew for a production. Offered 2nd and 4th term only. Alabama Art Standards
Course Objectives:	At the conclusion of this class, students will be able to perform for their class and have a basic knowledge of theatrical terms.
Classroom Expectations:	Classroom Rules and Procedures: <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. You may not have your cell phone out of your backpack for any reason.2. Pay attention to the teacher during instructions.3. Follow safety rules. You will sign a contract.4. Always be helpful and productive.5. Clean up at the end of each class.6. Ask questions.7. Use encouraging language and tone of voice.8. Try your best. Classroom Management Plan (link here)
Grading:	Test grades will account for 60% of the 9-weeks grade, with the remaining 40% being determined by quiz/daily grades. The grading scale is as follows: A (90-100), B (80-89), C (70-79), D (65-69), and F (below 65). Grades will be a reflection of mastery of the standards. Make sure all absences are excused as work can be made up and graded for excused absences only.

Make-up Work:	Under normal circumstances, it is expected that students will submit <u>previously</u> assigned work upon return to school after an excused absence. All work missed on the day(s) of excused absences must be made up within a timeframe determined by the teacher. It is the responsibility of the student to ensure he or she makes up work following excused absences. Students will not receive credit for and will not be allowed to make up any assignments, tests, work, activities, etc., missed during unexcused absences. (DMS 2025-2026 Student Handbook)
Late Work:	<p>For work turned in late, the following policy will apply:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The assignment will drop one LETTER grade for each school day that passes. For example, if an assignment is turned in one school day late, the highest a student can receive is 89%; two days late, 79%, etc. <p>1 day late = maximum credit 89% 2 days late = maximum credit 79% 3 days late = maximum credit 69% 4 days late = maximum credit 59% 5-10 days late = maximum credit 50%</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Half credit is always better than no credit! Until work has been made up, "Missing" (which counts as a zero) will be put in the grade book. This will be updated once work is completed and turned in.

Technology	<p>Concerning laptop utilization:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Student laptops should not be hard-wired to the network or have print capabilities. 2. Neither the teacher, nor the school is responsible for broken, stolen, or lost laptops. 4. Laptops will be used at the individual discretion of the teacher and should be brought to school daily.
