Course Description

"To help students prepare for college and future careers, the foundation for 7th Grade Language Arts stems from the Alabama College and Career Ready Standards for incoming 7th graders who will eventually progress to 8th Grade Language Arts. The content standards focus on four specific areas: reading, writing, speaking/listening, and language. In 7th Grade, students will have the opportunity to develop specific skills that will progress throughout their middle and high school careers. The reading standards concern students analyzing literature and informational text. Through this analysis, they will determine how literary devices interact, identify central themes, examine author's craft, and support their findings with textual evidence. In writing, students will construct clear and coherent writing in the basic modes – narrative, expository, and persuasive – while being supported through the writing process. In addition, they will be guided through the research process. According to the listening and speaking content standards, learners will engage effectively in collaborative discussions and presentations. Students will adapt speech to a variety of contexts and tasks along with analyzing the ideas of others. Lastly, within the language core, a command of Standard English conventions, when writing and speaking will be demonstrated, along with the acquisition of general academic and domain specific words." Vocabulary: Students will have 10-20 terms every other week. These will be assigned on Tuesdays and assessed the following Tuesday. Practice activities will occur before the assessment.

Bell Work: Bell work may be graded on the spot or collected at the end of the week. All notes and practice should be kept in order in your binder.

Article of the Month: Students will read and annotate a nonfiction article once a month. These will be assigned on Thursdays and due the following Thursday.

No-Name Papers

Unidentified papers will automatically receive half credit, if claimed. Unclaimed papers will receive a zero in the gradebook until claimed.

Passes

Students are expected to be in class on time. If you think you will be late to class, make sure you have a pass from your teacher.

Students must have a pass to leave the room. If you're returning from the office, nurse, or another teacher, your return pass must be signed as well.

Class Dismissal
