# COMING TO SCHOOL

- Your child can come to school on the bus, in a car through the car line, or as a walker.
- The morning car line drop off is at the back of the school. You will use the South Entrance to Columbia. You **cannot** drop your child off in the front parking lot.

# LUNCH

- We will be sending home your child's lunch number in your Open House folder.
- Students need to be able to open lunch items independently. Please practice at home.
- You may join us for lunch starting September 6th.
- The keypad in the lunchroom looks like this:



# SNACK

- Please pack snack separate from lunch.
- Pack your child's snack in a container or bag.
- Please send one healthy snack and water daily for your child.
- Students need to be able to open snack items independently.  
Please practice.

We recommend water bottles that snap open and close like the ones shown in the picture.

Always double check that it is closed tight before sending it in your child's backpack.

Please label the water bottle with your child's name.



# DAILY REST TIME

- We will have rest time daily.
- If you are sending a blanket, it must be attached to the rest mat.
- We will send rest mats home on Friday to be washed. Please return each Monday with your child.

# AFTERNOON TRANSPORTATION

- Color coded transportation tags will be given the first day. Please leave these attached to their backpacks.
- A Kindergarten teacher will escort the students to the proper spot each day.
- Each child receives a car line number. Please work to have your child memorize his/her car line number. The carline tag will have your child's teacher's name and their classroom number. Every time your child is a car rider, you need this number on your rearview mirror facing out.

# DISMISSAL

## CAR RIDERS

- Students will listen for memorized car line number.
- Students will enter the vehicle from the passenger side. Parents need to stay in the car.

## BUS RIDERS

- Students need to know their bus shape and bus driver's name.

## VAN RIDERS

- Students need to know the name of the van.

## WALKERS

- Students need to know if they are a “front” or “back” door walker. Please work on memorizing address.

# TRANSPORTATION CHANGES

- It is best for children to have a consistent transportation schedule.
- If a transportation change is necessary, you need to email no later than 2:00. You will not email your child's teacher. Please use following email address:


