Competition This Year

This year we will be participating in BOTH the Alabama Conference of Theatre Competition in the fall AND International Thespian Society Festival in the spring.

Fees for each competition / festival will be determined asap as possible.

The format of **Alabama Conference of Theatre Trumbauer Festival** will be virtual and will NOT include a one act component. Individual Events will be presented.

The format of the **International Thespian Society Festival** will be virtual as well. If plays are presented they will be videotaped. Since this festival is in the Spring there are some possibilities that the specifics may change. The directors will provide guidance as the structure of the festival becomes more clear.

Scholarship applications and auditions are generally due in late December / Early January. Students will be encouraged to enter portfolio selections for scholarship consideration.
