Textbook Information	No textbook is utilized for Creative Writing I.		
Course Description	In this course, students will explore how writing expands our understanding of the world, its people, and one's self. Students will receive an overview of writing strategies including an emphasis on narrative structure, mechanics, and craft. Students will create a variety of original pieces that encompass multiple genres including poetry, narratives, micro fiction and much more. By the end of the course, students will understand that creative writing is a reflective, multi-step process that benefits from collaboration and feedback from others.		
Course Objectives	Creative Writing provides students with opportunities to develop their literary talents. The purpose of creative writing is to inspire students to express themselves through the exploration of various writing styles and techniques. Students will develop clear and concise writing skills through the execution of writing assignments and the application of proofreading and editing skills. Students will develop and display clear written and verbal communication skills.		
Course Outline	Unit 1: Personal Narrative Unit 2: Poetry Unit 3: Comic Books Unit 4: Short Stories (Final project for the course) *These units are subject to change depending on the needs and interests of students in the class.		
Classroom Expectations	 No cell phones allowed during instructional time. Be seated and ready for class when the bell rings. Students tardy to class will receive a detention per LMS policy. Come prepared for class. Bring all necessary supplies. Respect your teacher, your classmates, and yourself. If it's not yours, don't touch it. Keep your hands and feet to yourself. Bring your school-issued Chromebook (fully charged) and charger daily. Keep all personal electronic devices (cell phones, air pods, headphones, tablets, etc.) silenced and stored in designated classroom location. All students must follow the Madison City Schools Code of Conduct.		
Technology & Cell Phone	Students should bring their MCS chromebooks and chargers to class each day. Teachers monitor student		
Procedures	activity and participation; however, students are responsible for their activity on school-issued devices and using their MCS accounts. Cell phones and earbuds/headphones will not be allowed to be used during classroom instruction time. Phones and earbuds/headphones will be put away in a location designated by the teacher and placed in silent mode. Students will have access to their phones and earbuds/headphones outside of classroom instruction time, such as between classes and during lunch, but devices should be put away when		

	students are in the serving line. Failure to follow these procedures will result in a disciplinary referral to the office.

Late Work Policy	10% will be deducted off the assignment per week late. After three weeks, the maximum grade a student can receive on a late assignment is 65%.	
Make-up Work/Test Policy	Students with excused absences will be allowed to make-up all work within THREE (3) days of returning to school per excused absence. It is the student's responsibility to ask for make-up work. Students are asked to check Schoology for any work missed in class. There is a weekly folder where the lesson will be available to access. Students will need to connect with the teacher to pick up any missed handouts upon return. For each assignment submitted on Schoology after the deadline, a Late/Missing Work Submission Form must be completed in order to receive a grade. If a student is absent on the day of the test, it is the student's responsibility to communicate with Mrs. Hutchison to schedule a day/time to make up the test. To receive credit, tests must be made up within three days of an absence	
Materials & Supplies	Students will need a three-prong folder, composition book, a small binder, or a designated section of a binder for this course.	
Homework	Students will not be assigned work to complete outside of the class block. The only way students will have homework is if they do not complete their classwork within the class block. Students will be given ample time to complete the assigned writing assignments in class.	
Cheating, Plagiarism, and AI	Cheating (Per the MCS Student Code of Conduct): A student who cheats will not receive credit for the work in question. If any other student has cooperated in the cheating, that student is also considered to have cheated and will not receive credit.
