Course Description	9 Weeks Course: In this course students explore the role of citizenship in the United States. The curriculum addresses representative democracy, law, personal economics, and civil responsibility.
Course Objectives	9 Weeks Course: The goal of this course is to create an environment for students to become competent citizens committed to the fundamental values and principles of the constitutional democracy, which established the republic of the United States of America. This nine-weeks course will provide numerous opportunities to achieve the objective of being informed and responsible citizens. Students will be able to respectfully engage critically and constructively in a dialogue of ideas through class discussion, small group assignments, and project-based learning.

<p>Grading Policy <i>(MCS Policy)</i></p>	<p>60% = Assessments (Tests, Essays, Projects) 40% = Daily Grades (Quizzes, Homework, Classwork, and Participation) Testing Days: Tuesday / Thursday</p>
<p>Late Work Policy</p>	<p>Late work will be accepted for up until the end of the unit. After the unit ends missing work will be submitted as a zero.</p>
<p>Make-up Work/Test Policy</p>	<p>Students with excused absences will be allowed to make-up all work within three days of returning to school. It is the student's responsibility to ask for make-up work. Students can get with a classmate, or ask the teacher for help. Work that is not made up will become a zero (including quizzes/tests). Many times, missed quizzes and tests can be made up during school.</p>
<p>Technology Policy</p>	<p>Students should bring their MCS chromebooks and chargers to class each day. Teachers utilize GoGuardian to monitor student activity and participation; however, students are responsible for their activity on the school-issued device and using their MCS accounts.</p> <p>Students are welcome to bring personal cell phones to school to be used between classes and during lunch. Students will not be allowed to use cell phones during class. All cell phones must be placed in students' backpacks or a cell phone holder that the teacher has placed in the designated area of the classroom during the entirety of the instructional block. Also, remember that the student is responsible for locking and securing personal devices. LMS is not responsible for lost, stolen, or damaged cell phones and other electronic devices. Students may not use their devices to do anything that would disrupt the learning environment at Liberty Middle School.</p>
