#### **Heroes Adventure Pack**

When packing for this reading adventure about heroes we suggest you include <u>The Boy Who Harnessed the Wind</u> by William Kamkwamba and Bryan Mealer. In *The Boy Who Harnessed the Wind*, William figures out how to build a windmill and bring electricity to his village. We also suggest adding <u>Tasty Baby Belly Buttons</u>, by Judy Sierra. *Tasty Baby Belly Buttons* is a traditional Japanese folktale featuring a girl born from a melon who rescues babies from the oni, monsters who steal babies to eat their belly buttons.

#### **Gardening Adventure Pack**

When packing for this reading adventure about gardening we suggest you include <u>Weslandia</u> by Paul Fleischman and <u>Plant (Eyewitness Books)</u> by David Burnie. In *Weslandia*, Wesley's crop of huge, strange plants gives him the opportunity to create a civilization of his own and make new friends in the process. In *Plant*, detailed, full-color photographs complement the interesting facts about the fascinating world of plants, including plant anatomy and growth.


#### **Birds Adventure Pack**

In <u>Aviary Wonders Inc. Spring Catalog and Instruction Manual</u>, by Kate Samworth, people who want to have experiences with birds are offered the opportunity to order parts to build their own — now necessary since nearly all birds have become extinct. <u>Crinkleroot's Guide to Knowing the Birds</u>, by Jim Arnosky, features the warm and folksy nature guide Crinkleroot, who introduces kids to birds and the pleasures of watching them.

#### **Robots Adventure Pack**

When packing for this reading adventure about robots we suggest you include <u>Robot Dreams</u> by Sara Varon and <u>Robot (Eyewitness Books)</u> by Roger Bridgman. *Robot Dreams* is a simple, endearing story of friendship and loss told through a wordless graphic novel. *Robot* offers a detailed, full-color guide to the fascinating world of machines that sense, think and act, including the history of artificial intelligence and robots at work.

#### **Rocks Adventure Pack**

The featured books are <u>The Jade Stone</u>, a Chinese folktale adapted by Caryn Yacowitz and the nonfiction book <u>Rocks in His Head</u> by Carol Otis Hurst. *Rocks in His Head* tells a real life story, about actual events and real people. It's about one man's fascination with rocks and how his lifelong interest in rocks made him a very happy man. The story is also a delightful introduction to looking closely at rocks, while it shows the positive, life-changing power of pursuing a personal interest. *The Jade Stone* shows the relationship a sculptor has with stone. It also shows the honorable commitment the artist has to his craft.

#### **Cooking Adventure Pack**

<u>Easy as Pie</u>, by Cari Best, tells the story a young boy, Jacob, who sets out to bake a peach pie to celebrate his parents' anniversary. Jacob is inspired by television personality Chef Monty who blends into his recipes great lessons for life — such as the importance of following directions, doing your best to fix unexpected difficulties, always leaving a workspace as orderly as you found it, and persistence. <u>How Did That Get in My Lunchbox?</u> illustrates the path food travels from the farm, to the market, and finally, to our plates at home and in lunchboxes for school. Understanding "where our food comes from" can encourage healthier food choices.

#### **Weather Adventure Pack**

The featured books are <u>Cloudy with a Chance of Meatballs</u> by Judi Barrett and <u>Weather</u> by Seymour Simon. <u>Cloudy with a Chance of Meatballs</u> tells a tall but tasty tale of wacky weather. In the town of Chewandswallow, the weather provides three delicious meals a day. But when severe weather comes to town bringing storms of gigantic food, Chewandswallow residents must figure out how to save themselves. In <u>Weather</u>, noted science writer Seymour Simon uses photographs to help explain what weather is. Readers are introduced to how general weather conditions are formed and the type of instruments used to help predict the weather.

#### **Building Adventure Pack**

Roberto: The Insect Architect tells the story of Roberto, a young termite who dreams of building with boards rather than eating them. When no one is willing to give Roberto a chance in the big city, he turns his attention to helping others, building homes anonymously for dispossessed insects. In <u>Construction Zone</u>, noted photojournalist Richard Sobol uses photographs to help explain the complex and challenging process of building a building. The building readers are introduced to is the Massachusetts Institute of Technology's Stata Center, designed by architect Frank O. Gehry.

#### Archaeology Adventure Pack

When packing for this reading adventure about archaeology we suggest you include Archaeologists Dig for Clues by Kate Duke and The Shipwrecked Sailor: An Egyptian Tale with Hieroglyphics by Tamara Bower. In Archaeologists Dig for Clues, young readers learn how archaeologists set up a dig site, what tools they use, and how they record their findings. The Shipwrecked Sailor is based on a real papyrus scroll of hieroglyphics that tells a tale of a voyage on the Red Sea to an enchanted land. Parts of the story are translated into hieroglyphics — pictures of people animals, and everyday objects.


