CLASS RULES / CONSEQUENCES (Basically - be KIND & RESPECTFUL)(when in classrooms)

- 1. Speak at appropriate times using an appropriate voice.
- 2. The teacher dismisses the class, not the bell.
- 3. Be in your seat and ready to work when the tardy bell rings.
- 4. Bring all needed class materials every day.
- 5. Leave all food and drinks in your locker or bag (gum too!)
- 6. Respect the teacher, your peers, and the environment.
- 7. Follow Cell phone usage policy.

GENERAL POLICIES

- 1. Have fun and strive to do your personal best.
- 2. Laugh at yourself, but not at others.
- 3. Students will be expected to perform in front of the class almost every day. If there is a performance test, students must present it on the scheduled day, unless we make other arrangements beforehand. Do NOT come to me on performance day and beg for an extension. I won't give it to you! If a student is not prepared, he/she will receive a zero grade for the performance.
- 4. Treat every day as a day to learn something new, and as a day to master the skills already learned. Many daily class activities can't be made up when a student is absent because of the "hands-on" nature of the class. However, for the daily grades that can be made up, and for all individual test grades, the student must have an excused absence turned in within three days in order to receive a make-up assignment, which must then be turned in within a week. If the absence is unexcused, a zero will result per school policy. All make-up performances must be given through an appointment made with the teacher by the student –within 10 days. For all group test performances, the student will have a theatre-based research paper assigned and due by the end of the following week.

GRADING POLICY

70% = Test Grades: Projects, Performances, Rehearsals, Tests, and Quizzes 30% = Daily Grades: In-Class Activities, Homework, and Class Participation

OUT OF CLASS PERFORMANCES - MANDATORY!!!

I'm not sure what this will look like yet as it will depend wholly on whether or not we are meeting face to face, or still meeting remotely. Either way, the students WILL have a performance of some kind! I have several ideas, but I have to wait to see how the world-saga unfolds before I know which idea will best suit the class. I will announce the performance date the week we are back from fall break.

**The showcase will count as ¾ of their final exam grade.

** "One absent individual can have an enormous negative impact on a team effort." This concept is no different than that of a sports team. EVERYONE is needed to attain success. ONLY a **doctor's note**, specifically stating that a child is unable to attend the performance will be accepted. If a child is experiencing something that does not warrant a visit to the doctor, I expect that child to be on stage/screen. "The show must go on!!"
