Grading Policy (MCS Policy)	60% = Assessments (Tests, Essays, Projects) 40% = Daily Grades (Quizzes, Homework, Classwork, and Participation)	
Late Work Policy	Late work will be accepted until the end of each unit. Students will need to fill out and attach the Late Work slip to their work before placing it in the labeled basket. Once final grades are posted, all zeroes for missing work will be final.	
Make-up Work / Test Policy	Students with excused absences will be allowed to make-up all work within three days of returning to school . It is the student's responsibility to ask for make-up work. Students can get with a classmate or ask the teacher for help. Work that is not made up will become a zero (including quizzes/tests).	
Homework	Mrs. Harvard will be utilizing class time for all assignments and activities. Students will only have homework if they fail to complete the work within their allotted class time, or after an absence. When working toward performances, students are encouraged to rehearse outside of school as well as during class.	
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
