<b>Technology &amp; Cell Phone / Digital Device Procedures</b>	<p>Effective July 1, 2025, the use, operation, or possession of Wireless Communications Devices including but not limited to cellular telephones, tablet computers, laptop computers, pagers, gaming devices, smart watches, earphones or headphones in school buildings or on school grounds during the Instructional Day, is prohibited. <b>Progressive Discipline</b>	<p>Liberty Middle School Classroom Management Plan:</p> <p><b>Step 1:</b> Verbal warning</p> <p><b>Step 2:</b> Student/teacher conference with parent notification</p> <p><b>Step 3:</b> Parent contact/conference</p> <p><b>Step 4:</b> Detention</p> <p><b>Step 5:</b> Referral to administration for repeat Class I violations and initial Class II and Class III offenses (<a href="#">Madison City Schools Code of Conduct</a>)</p> <p><b>Exception: Students who are disrespectful or insubordinate to a substitute teacher will receive a call home and automatic detention.</b></p>
<b>Grading Policy (MCS Policy)</b>	<p><b>60%</b> = Assessments (Tests, Essays, Projects)</p> <p><b>40%</b> = Daily Grades (Quizzes, Homework, Classwork, and Participation)</p>
<b>Late Work Policy</b>	<p><i>Late work will be accepted until the end of each unit.</i></p> <p><i>Students will need to fill out and attach the Late Work slip to their work before placing it in the labeled basket.</i></p> <p><i>Once final grades are posted, all zeroes for missing work will be final.</i></p>
<b>Make-up Work / Test Policy</b>	<p>Students with excused absences will be allowed to make-up all work <b>within three days of returning to school</b>. It is the student's responsibility to ask for make-up work. Students can get with a classmate or ask the teacher for help. Work that is not made up will become a zero (including quizzes/tests).</p>
<b>Homework</b>	<p>Mrs. Harvard will be utilizing class time for all assignments and activities. Students will only have homework if they fail to complete the work within their allotted class time, or after an absence. <b><i>When working toward performances, students are encouraged to rehearse outside of school as well as during class.</i></b></p>
<b>AI Policy</b>	<p><b>AI Policy MCS Policy:</b> District policy is that it is the school's responsibility to educate students on AI and train them to utilize it in an ethical way. AI software collects personal data and is usually blocked for that reason when school email addresses are used.</p> <p><b>Mrs. Harvard's Classroom Policy:</b> AI-assisted or AI-created work <i>could be</i> permissible depending on the assignment.
