Textbook Information	Essential Elements for Band, Book 1
	Parents and guardians can access other supplementary materials through the Schoology platform.
Course Description	This course is designed for students that already know how to play an instrument. An audition is required. Instruments must be provided by each student. Students in this band continue to develop and refine basic individual and ensemble skills as well as begin to learn more advanced concepts and skills. Students in Intermediate Band are eligible for the (optional) spring band trip. Mandatory graded performances include (but are not limited to) three evening concerts per year, all Pep Band performances, and MPA (Music Performance Assessment) for a major portion of their grade.
Course Objectives	Students in Intermediate Band will continue to develop a good characteristic tone on their instruments. They will be able to maintain a steady pulse within a musical meter, and will demonstrate accurate rhythmic values for both notes and rests. Students will develop appropriate instrument fundamentals including tone production, articulation, fingerings, phrasing, and dynamics. Students will practice correct playing posture and hand position. Students will also exhibit appropriate etiquette during rehearsals and performances.
Course Outline	Overarching Objective: Basic and Intermediate Music Reading and Instrument Fundamentals Unit 1: Pep Band Music Preparation (Pep Band Performances count as test grade) Unit 2: Holiday Music Preparation (Assessments - Halloween and Winter Concerts) Unit 3: State MPA Music Preparation (Assessments - Dessert Concert and MPA Performance) Unit 4: Solo and Ensemble Fundamentals (Final Assessment - Solo Performance) Unit 5: Spring Concert Music Preparation (Final Assessment - Spring Concert)  *Students will be required to attend the Solo and Ensemble Festival (Apr. 11) in the Spring Semester.
Classroom Expectations	<ol> <li>Cell phones must be powered down and in a backpack from 8:15 am - 3:20 pm</li> <li>Be seated and ready for class when the bell rings. Receiving multiple tardies to class will result in disciplinary action following LMS policy.</li> <li>Students must have all required equipment for every rehearsal: instrument, book, music, pencil, instrument accessories (ie. reeds, mouthpiece, neck strap, sticks/mallets, etc).</li> <li>Respect your directors, your classmates, and yourself.</li> <li>Listen and follow directions.</li> <li>Do not touch other student's instruments or equipment. Do not play other student's instruments. Do not trade instruments.</li> <li>Follow all school rules.</li> <li>No eating or drinking (except water) in the band room. Gum is never allowed during class time.</li> <li>Only band students are allowed to enter the band room.</li> <li>The teacher dismisses the class, not the bell.</li> </ol> All students must follow the Madison City Schools Code of Conduct.

Technology & Cell Phone/Digital Device Procedures	Effective July 1, 2025, the use, operation, or possession of Wireless Communications Devices including but not limited to cellular telephones, tablet computers, laptop computers, pagers, gaming devices, smart watches, earphones or headphones in school buildings or on school grounds during the Instructional Day, is prohibited. Violation of Board policy with respect to such use, operation, or possession of Wireless Communication Devices may constitute a Class II. Grading Policy (MCS Policy)	60% = Assessments (Playing Tests, Required Performances) 40% = Daily Grades (Music Checks, Quizzes, Homework)
Late Work Policy	A student may make up missed assignments; however, they will lose points for work turned in late:  Work that is <u>less</u> than 1 week past due (minus 10 points)  Work that is <u>more</u> than 1 week past due (minus 20 points)  Work may <u>not</u> be submitted after the grading period ends
Make-up Work/Test Policy	Students with excused absences will be allowed to make-up all work within 1 week of returning to school without being penalized. It is the student's responsibility to ask for make-up work. Students can consult with a classmate or teacher for help. Work that is not made up will become a zero (including quizzes/tests).  Please see the <i>LMS Band Handbook</i> for policies pertaining to missed playing assignments or missed performances due to absences.
Materials & Supplies	Essential Elements for Band, Book 1 (specific to each instrument)  Flip folder and lyre (specific to each instrument)  Instrument and required accessories (i.e. reeds, neck straps, valve oil, slide grease, etc.)  Appropriate instrument cleaning supplies (varies by instrument)  Pencils  Folding stand (recommended for at home practice - not required for class)
Homework	Students are expected to practice 10-15 minutes each day. During weeks without a mandatory performance, students may be assigned a recorded (video) playing excerpt to be submitted on Schoology.
Band Booster Organization	The LMS Band Boosters is a parent organization which supports the band by providing fundraising, chaperoning, and logistical assistance. The Boosters meet once each 9-weeks in the LMS Band room. Parents of students in all ensembles are encouraged to attend. The first LMS Band Boosters meeting will take place on Aug. 25 at 6:30pm. All other meeting dates can be found in the LMS Band yearly calendar of events.
