Course Description	This course is designed for students that already know how to play an instrument. An audition is required. Instruments must be provided by each student. Students in this band continue to develop and refine basic individual and ensemble skills as well as begin to learn more advanced concepts and skills. Students in Symphonic Bands are eligible for the (optional) Spring Band trip. Mandatory graded performances include (but are not limited to) three evening concerts per year, all Pep Band performances, and Music Performance Assessment for a major portion of their grade. All students in the Symphonic Band are required to audition for District 1 Honor Band/Alabama All-State Band.
Course Objectives	Students in the Symphonic Band will produce a consistent characteristic tone, and exhibit good intonation alone or within the ensemble. Students will demonstrate rhythmic proficiency up to sixteenth notes and sixteenth rests in both simple and compound meters. Students will develop awareness and understanding of ensemble playing; with consideration for balance, blend, style, and expression. Students will exhibit proper musical and mechanical fundamentals on their instruments. Students are expected to master their assigned musical selections at performance level accuracy.

Classroom Expectations	1. Cell phones must be powered down and in a backpack from 8:15 am - 3:20 pm
	2. Be seated and ready for class when the bell rings. Receiving multiple tardies to class will result in disciplinary action following LMS policy.
	3. Students must have all required equipment for every rehearsal: instrument, book, music, pencil, instrument accessories (ie. reeds, mouthpiece, neck strap, sticks/mallets, etc).
	4. Respect your directors, your classmates, and yourself.
	5. Listen and follow directions.6. Do not touch other student's instruments or equipment. Do not play other student's instruments. Do not trade
	instruments.
	7. Follow all school rules.
	8. No eating or drinking (except water) in the band room. Gum is never allowed during class time.
	9. Only band students are allowed to enter the band room.
	10. The teacher dismisses the class, not the bell.
	All students must follow the Madison City Schools Code of Conduct.

Technology & Cell Phone/Digital Device Procedures	Effective July 1, 2025, the use, operation, or possession of Wireless Communications Devices including but not limited to cellular telephones, tablet computers, laptop computers, pagers, gaming devices, smart watches, earphones or headphones in school buildings or on school grounds during the Instructional Day, is prohibited. Grading Policy (MCS Policy)	 60% = Assessments (Playing Tests, Required Performances) 40% = Daily Grades (Music Checks, Quizzes, Homework)
Late Work Policy	A student may make up missed assignments; however, they will lose points for work turned in late:
	Work that is <u>less</u> than 1 week past due (minus 10 points) Work that is <u>more</u> than 1 week past due (minus 20 points) Work may <u>not</u> be submitted after the grading period ends
Make-up Work/Test Policy	Students with excused absences will be allowed to make-up all work within 1 week of returning to school without being penalized. It is the student's responsibility to ask for make-up work. Students can consult with a classmate or teacher for help. Work that is not made up will become a zero (including quizzes/tests). Please see the <i>LMS Band Handbook</i> for policies pertaining to missed playing assignments or missed performances due to absences.
Materials & Supplies	Tuned In, A Comprehensive Approach to Band Intonation (specific to each instrument) Assigned All-State Audition book for your instrument (listed in "Textbook" section above) Instrument and required instrument accessories (i.e. reeds, neck straps, valve oil, slide grease, etc.) Flip folder and lyre (specific to each instrument) Appropriate instrument cleaning supplies (varies by instrument) Pencils Folding stand (recommended for at home practice - not required for class)
Homework	Students are expected to practice their instruments for 10-15 minutes each day. During weeks without a mandatory performance, students may be assigned a recorded (video) playing excerpt to be submitted on Schoology.
Band Booster Organization	The LMS Band Boosters is a parent organization which supports the band by providing fundraising, chaperoning, and logistical assistance. The Boosters meet once each 9-weeks in the LMS Band room. Parents of students in all ensembles are encouraged to attend. The first LMS Band Boosters meeting will take place on Aug. 25 at 6:30pm. All other meeting dates can be found in the LMS Band yearly calendar of events.
